Glue
Brads
Ribbon

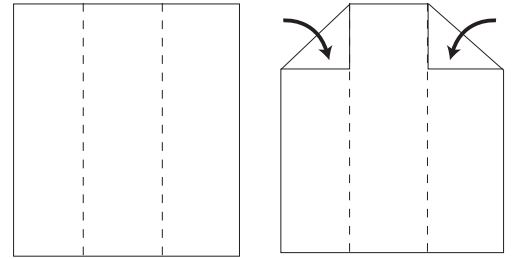
Invitation Envelope

Looking for a different way to send an invitation to your friends and family? This will certainly make it stand out. Use coordinating paper and embellishments to make this invite something really special.

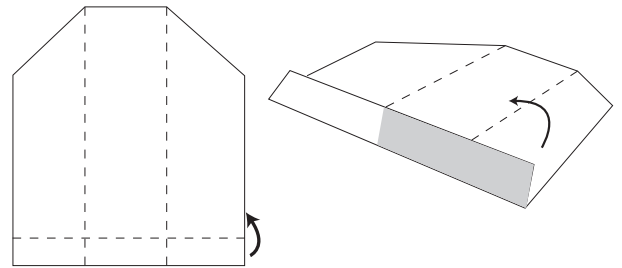


1: Make Envelope-

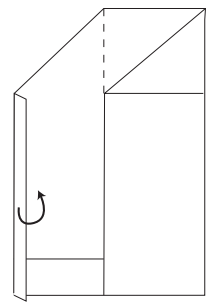
Fold your paper into thirds vertically. Turn your paper over and fold in the corners back as shown in second image.



2 : Turn the paper back over so that the folds are at the back. Fold up a 40 mm high flap from the bottom. Glue together parts in grey on image so that when the right side is folded over into the centre, they will be secured at the bottom.

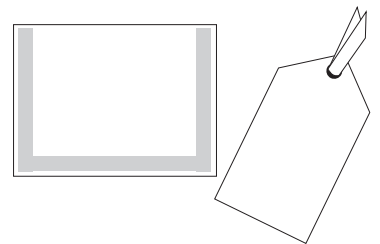


3: Fold in a flap approx 15 mm from the left side and glue down.



4: Make the pocket with Tag for the front-

Cut a piece of contrasting paper 75 mm wide x 55 mm high for your front pocket. Glue down both sides and the bottom to the front of your envelope, (shown in grey on first image) so that it makes a small pocket. For the tag, cut a 55 mm wide x 80 mm high rectangle. Cut off the corners to make a point. Hole punch a hole in the middle of the point as shown. Thread through a piece of ribbon approx 60 mm long and glue middle of ribbon together.



4: Make the ribbon Tie-

Cut a piece of ribbon 270mm long. Make a small hole in the front of your envelope, 20 mm in from the right hand side and 30 mm up from the corner of your pocket. Hold the ribbon behind the layer of paper with end trailing out to the right. Holding the ribbon in place, put a large circle brad in the hole and pierce the ribbon. Wrap the ribbon around the envelope and then around brad. The brad will hold the ribbon in place.
