Ribbon
Foam Dots
Pearls
Scissors

Valentine Chocolate Box

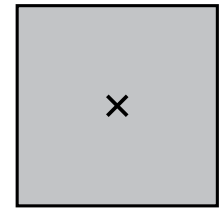


This simple and easy to make chocolate box is a great valentines day idea or the perfect gift box for a loved one. Remove the divider or change the scrapbooking paper to suit any occasion and use as an everyday versatile box.



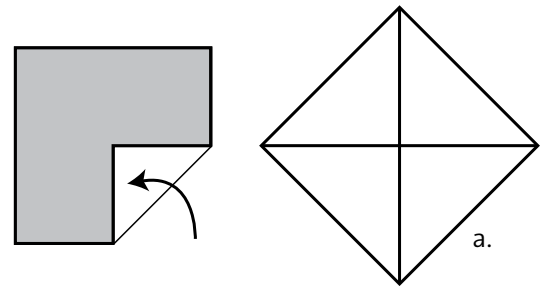
1: To make the BASE of the box.

Get one of your three of 12" x 12" (305mm x 305mm) scrapbooking paper, and cut a 5mm strip off the top and one of the sides. You should now have a square the is 11.8" x 11.8" (300mm x 300mm). Find the centre of the square and make a small mark.



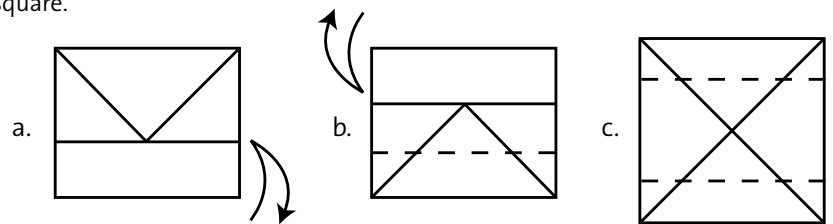
The paper facing downward will be the colour of the completed box base.

2: Fold all four corners into the centrepoint.
Your box base should now look like diagram a.



3: Spin your paper around so the paper is arranged in a square.

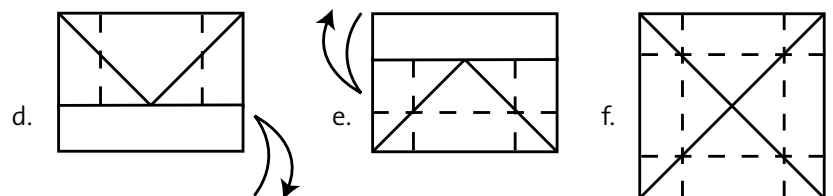
Fold the bottom edge up to meet the centre.
Make a firm crease then reopen the fold (a).
Turn the paper around and do it again to the other side. {Crease and unfold (b)}



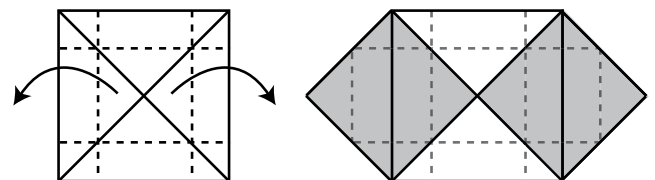
Your box base should now look like diagram c.

4: Repeat step 3 to the remaining two sides (a and b).

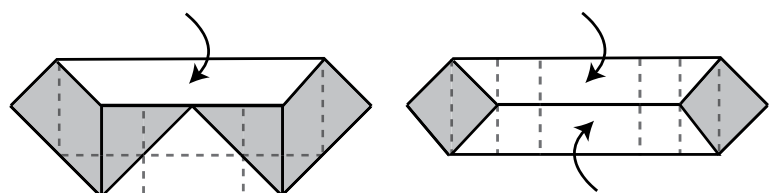
Your box base should now look like diagram c.



5: Completely fold out the left and right sides.

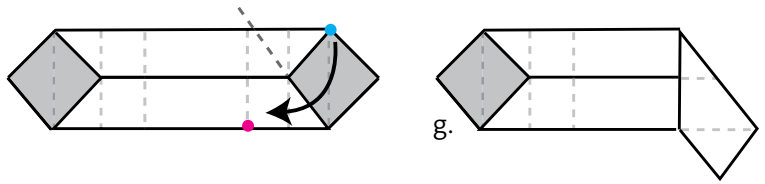


6: Fold the top third downwards into the centrepoint along the creases made in step 3. Make a firm crease.
Repeat his for the bottom edge by bring it up to meet in the centre.





7: Fold down the top right hand corner (Blue dot) so that it meets the Pink dot. Your paper should look like diagram a.

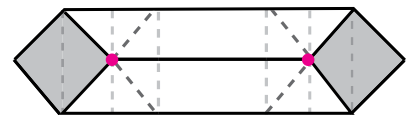


Crease firmly and unfold again.

This is so you have a dominant diagonal fold line to bring the box together.

Repeat this on remaining 3 sides.

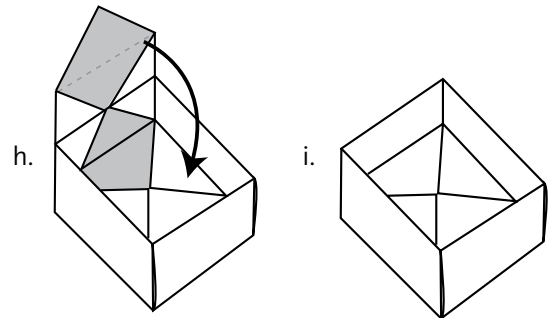
8: With 4 diagonal creases made; Hold your paper with thumbs in position of the pink dots, and your index finger in the same position at the back of the paper.



Bring thumbs upwards and inwards, as if you were trying to touch your thumbs together.

The box base should form.

9: Tuck in the flaps of the box inwards (as shown in diagram a.) The base of your box is now complete and should look like diagram b.

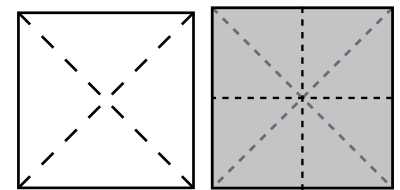


10. Glue or double sided stick the flaps onto the bottom of the box for stability.

11. To make the lid of your box, get a second piece of your 12" x 12" (305mm x 305mm) scrapbooking paper and repeat steps 1-10.

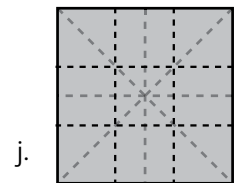
12. You should now have a lid and a base.

If you wish to make the chocolate divider, Get your third piece of 12" x 12" (305mm x 305mm) scrapbooking paper. The final divider colour will be the side facing upwards. crease along both diagonals in both directions. Firmly fold and unfold.

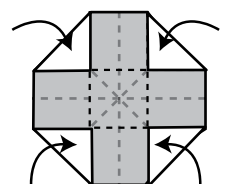


Turn the paper over and fold the paper in half in both directions. Firmly fold and unfold.

13. Fold the paper in thirds in both directions. Fold and unfold. Your paper should look like diagram j.



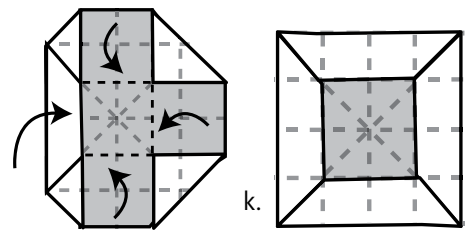
14. Fold all 4 corners into the creased square in the centre. Firmly fold.





7: Fold all 4 of the outer edges inward, to meet the sides of that centre square.

Your paper should look like diagram k. Firmly fold.

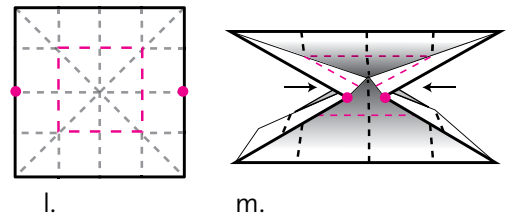


8: Turn the paper over. Grab hold of the paper. With thumbs in position of pink dots (l).

Pull thumbs with paper, upwards and inwards. As if you were trying to touch your thumbs together.

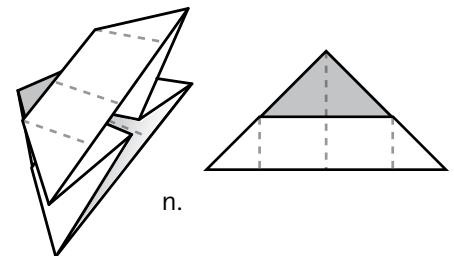
Bring together until 2 paper edges meet (where the pink dots were) (m).

The creases made, should fold in on themselves.



9: Now squash paper down flat into a triangle.

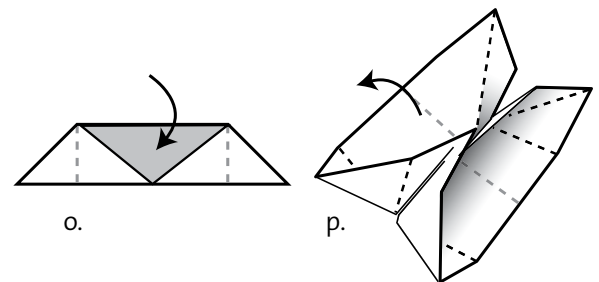
Your paper should look like the two n diagrams.



10: Fold down the top triangle (o).

Now take hold of the triangle with the first flap underneath it and open out as shown in diagram p.

The outer sections of your paper should lie flat, however the central area will not.



11: Your paper should now look like diagram q.

Sections marled 1 and 2 should be laying flat.

12: Fold the paper in half along the pink dotted line, so that the model folds back on itself

13: Your paper should now look like diagram r.

Place inside the base of your box and fill with chocolates or any gifts.

Embellish the lid of your box using tags, borders and cut out pictures from paper collection.

Decorate with pearls and rhinestones.
