

Materials

Scrapbooking Paper
Cutter
Twine
Tags/ Cut out elements



Napkin Holder



Cut your 12" x 12" (305mm x 305mm) scrapbooking paper into 4, so you have 4, 6" x 6" (152.5mm x 152.5mm) squares. Each 12" x 12" paper will make 4 napkin holders.

1: Take your first piece of paper (always keeping the paper arranged as a diamond). Fold and unfold the paper corner to corner in both directions (a).

2: Fold the upper and lower corners into the centre point. Make a firm crease.

3: Unfold the lower flap and refold it half the way so that it meets with the crease you made in step 2 (b). Make a firm crease and unfold. Then fold that same lower flap so that the point meets the top of your paper (c).

4: Completely unfold the paper, spin 180°. Refold the upper flap that was folded in step 2. Now repeat step 3 to the new lower flap (d and e). Completely unfold. Your paper should now have 7 horizontal folds as seen in diagram f.

5: Turn the paper over and fold the bottom corner up to meet the first crease, then unfold (g). Fold the bottom corner up to meet the 5th crease from the TOP POINT, unfold (h). Fold the bottom corner up again to meet the 3rd crease from the TOP POINT, unfold (i). Then fold the bottom corner up to meet the first crease from the TOP POINT (j).

6: Completely unfold the paper, spin 180°. Repeat step 5. Your paper should have 15 horizontal folds as seen in diagram k.

7: Starting from the bottom, fold up the bottom corner and so on, as if you were folding a fan.

Fold only to the centre crease (l). Repeat this starting from the top corner into the centre crease.

8. Join the two ends together to make a loop. Tape for stability. Tie some twine or ribbon around the holder and attach a tag.
